- · Keep garage doors closed
- Keep cars locked and remove valuables
- · Trim back shrubs from in front of windows
- · Keep doors and windows closed and locked
- Use exterior lighting and or motion detection lighting
- Utilize the police dept when on vacation to do a daily walk around your house, you can make this request at the Safety Services building. They are hoping to streamline and put the request form online in the future.
- Be a nosey neighbor, look out your windows and be aware of what's going on in your area
